The event is Greater Ashmont Main Street's biggest fundraiser; proceeds help make possible the programs and activities that support and enhance businesses in the district's 1.1- mile stretch of Dorchester Avenue. The event sold out last year, so do plan ahead!

## **February Meeting Notes**

James Baker, the developer for 500 Talbot Avenue (Our Saviour's Lutheran Church), gave an update on the project. It will include 40 residential units, 23 parking spaces, and two commercial spaces, one to be used by the church; there is local interest in a "New Yorkstyle" grocery or other retail in the commercial space. Working with the church to determine how they would use their space in the building has taken a lot of time; they are now thinking of a coffee shop or co-working space. The project will likely be submitted to the BPDA in April, and their formal process will begin. Project plans and a way to comment can be found at courbanize.com/projects/ talbot/information. You do need to log in to comment.

Allan Robinson and Ashley Yeats of 11R Alban Street presented their plans to remove an existing back deck and replace it with a smaller one that gives better access to their small back patio. They also plan to swap the positions of a window and back door, preserving the double-hung sash, moulding and trim, and to add a window on the south side. The columns and railings of the new deck would reflect the details on the front porch, and the space under the deck would be attractively screened. Their project requires a cou-

ple of variances relating to setbacks from the Board of Appeals; the AHA members present voted unanimously to send a letter of support from the association to the ZBA.

State Rep. Evandro Carvalho, who was running for State Senate to fill Linda Dorcena Forry's seat, introduced himself. He came to the US from Cape Verde at age 15, attended UMass Amherst and Howard University Law School, worked as an assistant district attorney, and was elected state rep in 2014. He wants to give opportunities to troubled youth, opposes mandatory minimums, supports CORI reform, wants more economic development and better transportation in the district, and puts opiate abuse high on the list of concerns. (Note: When Suffolk County DA Dan Conley announced that he would not run for re-election, Rep. Carvalho decided to run for that position instead.)

C-11 Report: The individual responsible for numerous robberies of local businesses over the last couple of months was finally identified, after a lot of good detective work, and was arrested in front of his home while in the process of trying to carjack and rob his drug dealer. Some neighbors had a frightening encounter with someone making a delivery to O'Brien's and reported it to C-11; charges were filed and the individual was expected to lose his job. Several arrests have been made in connection with the death of a young man in Codman Square.


