### **October Meeting Notes**

Thanks to Lex Stevens and David Stitt for hosting the meeting and to all who came out on a rainy night.

C-11 Community Service Officer Mike Keaney reported a car break on Burt Street; a speeding car on Brent Street that was stopped and had no insurance; a man arrested on Bailey Street who had exposed himself on Fuller; a shooting in the St. Mark's area that was followed by the arrest of the suspect, who was known to police. As the holidays approach, be on the lookout for possible thefts of packages left on porches

Lt. Ken Berg from the Transit Police, the new Night Lieutenant for the T's South District, reported that crime is down significantly in this area. To counter a spike in disorderly conduct and fighting by kids, Operation Stopwatch is being brought in to do on-the-spot intervention to get kids back on track. ### Fall Leaf/Yard Waste Collection Continues

Weekly collections run through December 2, with pickups on regular trash/recycling days; no yard waste will be collected with trash during this period. Place leaves and yard debris in large paper leaf bags or open barrels labeled "yard waste" (no plastic bags). Tie branches with string, 3' maximum length. Do not put branches in barrels. Put barrels, bags and branches at the curb by 7 a.m. on your regular trash/recycling day. Call 3-1-1 if your bags and barrels have been missed.
