Dot Greenway Update Meeting

Greater Ashmont Main Street will hold a meeting focused on the Dot Greenway on Tuesday, January 22, 6-7:30 p.m., in its office at 1914 Dorchester Avenue (in The Carruth facing Ashmont Station). Greater Ashmont MS has envisioned a park on the Red Line tunnel cap since 2012. In May 2017, RODE Architects/OJB Design laid out the first plans, following the tunnel cap from behind the Englewood Apartments in Peabody Square to Park Street in Fields Corner. (See full proposal at tinyurl.com/DotGreenwayProposal.) Since then, our State House delegation has secured no less than \$2 million for project build out. The Livable Streets Alliance has agreed to act as the project's fiscal agent, which makes it possible to apply for Community Preservation Grant funds for design and structural engineering feasibility. Come to this meeting get an update on all aspects of the project and next steps to make the Dot Greenway a reality.

BPDA Meeting re: 1970 Dot Ave

The Boston Planning and Development Agency will hold a community

meeting regarding the development proposal for 1970 Dorchester Avenue (the lot just south of The Carruth) on Thursday, January 24, 6:30-8 p.m., in Peabody Hall at All Saints Church. The developer, Mike Ahern, presented the project at the September AHA meeting; this is the official community meeting required as part of the Article 80 Small Project Review process. The proposal is for 32 studio and 24 one-bedroom apartments, two street-level retail spaces, five indoor parking spaces, a gym/media room, community room, and covered bicycle storage.
