Winter Farmers Market Starts Jan. 27

The Dorchester Winter Farmers Market returns to the Great Hall, 6 Norfolk Street in Codman Square, on Saturdays, 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., from January 27 to March 31. Each week, the market brings together local farmers, food producers, artists, and more, so you can get fresh, local produce and goods right here in the neighborhood.

This year's vendors include, for produce, Oakdale Farm, Farmer Dave, and Mycoterra Farm (fresh local gourmet mushrooms); for meat/seafood/dairy, Stonycreek Farm and Moonlight Farm; Iggy's Bread; and Bittersweet Herb Farm, offering flavored oils, vinegars, herb mixes, etc., plus honey from Tewksbury Farm. Funds for Peabody Square: *Follow-up*

As noted in the last issue of the *Outlook*, Greater Ashmont Main Street was crowdfunding in November and December for additional improvements to Peabody Square, including seating, plantings, paving, and more. Here is their report at the end of the effort:

Prizes are awarded for Best of Show, Best Non-Beef, Most Creative, and Best Team Spirit. And in the ever-popular People's Choice Award, the team with the most

(purchased) votes wins. The popular event is organized by the Ashmont Adams Neighborhood Association; all proceeds help support the Dorchester Day Parade.

The \$50 registration fee for participants is due by Tuesday, February 20; checks payable to "AANA/Chili Cookoff" should be mailed to Patricia O'Neil, 319 Ashmont Street, Dorchester 02124. Note that all chili must be prepared in a certified commercial kitchen; team up with a restaurant or caterer and offer a joint entry, or ask a restaurant, caterer, or other commercial enterprise if you can use their kitchen. Aluminum pans for the chili (10 quarts) are provided to each entrant in advance; chafing dishes are set up at each entrant's table at the IBEW. Chili must be brought to the cook-off already heated; a city health inspector checks to be sure it is at regulation temperature when it is served. Participants are given credentials for three individuals to set up and serve.

Cook-off tickets are \$20/adult, \$30 for family up to 4, additional children \$5 each; mark your calendars now, and look for more details about the event in the next *Outlook*. Info: Pat O'Neill, 617-265-5397 or pattiashmont@gmail.com.

Taxpayers who earned less than \$54,000 in 2017 can have their taxes prepared, and claim important tax credits such as the Earned Income Tax Credit, at free tax clinics held at the Wellness and Fitness Center, at 450 Washington Street, starting on January 20 and running into April. Hours are Mondays and Tuesdays from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m, and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. The free tax preparation is offered by the Codman Square Health Center in partnership with the Boston Tax Help Coalition.
